Dear colleagues,

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its sixth session called "on all actors to work together to enable the scaling up of financing to developing country Parties for climate action from all public and private sources to at least USD 1.3 trillion per year by 2035." ¹

In this context, Parties decided to launch, under the guidance of the Presidencies of the sixth and seventh sessions of the CMA, in consultation with Parties, the "Baku to Belém Roadmap to 1.3T" (henceforth Roadmap), aiming at scaling up climate finance to developing country Parties to support low greenhouse gas emissions and climate-resilient development pathways and implement the nationally determined contributions and national adaptation plans including through grants, concessional and non-debt creating instruments, and measures to create fiscal space, taking into account relevant multilateral initiatives as appropriate. It also requested us, as the Presidencies to produce a report summarizing the work as we conclude the work by CMA 7.²

In response to this mandate, as the Presidencies of the sixth and seventh sessions of the CMA, we issued a <u>notification</u> on 21 February 2025 inviting submissions from Parties, constituted bodies, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, particularly from the private sector, on their views in relation to their overall expectations for the Roadmap, topics and thematic issues to inform the Roadmap, country experiences, best practices and lessons learned related to the issues under the Roadmap and relevant multilateral initiatives. To date, we have received a total of 110 submissions from Parties and non-Party stakeholders.³ We wish to thank all Parties and stakeholders for their interest.

We also convened <u>virtual consultations</u> with Parties and groups of Parties on 4 March 2025 to discuss their views and expectations on the Roadmap.

Informed by the views and information received through submissions and consultations held with groups of Parties, we developed a <u>work plan</u> which presents our approach to the organization of work on the development of the Roadmap. This plan also includes structured outreach and engagement with Parties and non-Party stakeholders as well as the activities that will be carried out during this period.

As we approach the 62nd session of the Subsidiary Bodies (SB 62) scheduled for 16–26 June 2025 at the World Conference Centre Bonn, Germany, we would like to notify Parties and observer States as well as United Nations organizations, admitted observer organizations and other non-Party stakeholders that we intend to convene two open consultation events in conjunction with SB 62 on the

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"Baku to Belém Roadmap to 1.3T". A consultation event with Parties will take place on Monday, 16 June from 14:00 - 17:00 and a consultation with non-Party stakeholders will take place on Thursday, 19 June from 10:00 - 12:00, respectively. Further information, including the programmes will be communicated on the <u>UNFCCC webpage</u> in due course.
