Dear colleagues,

As part of the “[Global Mutirão](#): Uniting humanity in a global mobilization against climate change” decision adopted by Parties at COP 30 in Belém, Parties decided to “establish a two-year work programme on climate finance, including on Article 9, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement in the context of Article 9 of the Paris Agreement as a whole” (hereinafter referred to as “Climate Finance Work Programme”).

Following our appointment as Co-Chairs, we issued a [notification](#) on 23 March 2026 inviting submissions from Parties, constituted bodies, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, including from the private sector, on their overall expectations, outputs and outcomes, thematic pillars and the organization of work. To date, we have received a total of 66 submissions from Parties and non-Party stakeholders.<sup>1</sup> We wish to thank all Parties and non-Party stakeholders for their interest in contributing to this work.

We are pleased to provide information on the engagement workshops on the Climate Finance Work Programme. The following workshops will be held in conjunction with the sixty-fourth session of the Subsidiary Bodies (SB 64) at the World Conference Center Bonn, in Bonn, Germany:

- **Engagement Workshop among Parties – Monday, 8 June 2026, 15:00–18:00 CEST**
